Tsushima's Hospitality Stations

Tsushima's Hospitality Stations are facilities in the city that can provide directions and recommendations for spots to visit in Tsushima. As well, they offer visitors access to restrooms and places to rest. Stop by one of these stations as you wander the city; you may encounter something wonderful.

01 Tsushima-jinja Shrine

01 B-3 津島神社

Founded in 540 AD, this is the head shrine of the more than 3,000 Tsushima-jinja Shrines found across Japan. It is revered as a Tennen-sha Shrine alongside with the Yasaka Jinja Shrine in Kyoto, and is visited by around 1 million people each year. The enshrined deity is Takehaya-Susanoo-no-Mikoto, who has been worshipped since ancient times as the god of protection from pestilence and misfortune. The shrine was formerly known as Tsushima Gozu Tennen-sha Shrine.

The shrine also has deep ties to the Oda, Toyotomi, and Tokugawa clans, all of whom were active during the Sengoku period. It is said that the main hall was donated by Matsudaira Tadayoshi's wife, Masako, who prayed for the health of Tadayoshi, the fourth son of Tokugawa Ieyasu and lord of Kiyosu Castle and that the tower gate was donated by Toyotomi Hideyoshi. Both the main hall and the tower gate are designated as Important Cultural Properties of Japan.

Within the grounds, the spirit of Susanoo-no-Mikoto is enshrined in six shrines: the main hall, Ara Mitama no Yashiro, Niji Mitama no Yashiro, Kashiwagi no Yashiro, Imori-sha, and Hashika no Yashiro. It is said to be rare for one shrine to have six such shrines.

02 Tennohgawa Park

02 C-4 ~ C-6 D-4 ~ D-6 天王川公園

Opened in 1920, this park features beautiful flowers, greenery, and water. It was selected as one of Japan's Best 100 Historical Parks. The Tennen River, a tributary of the Kiso River flowed north-south through the city until the Edo period. It was dammed and developed as the current Maruike Pond. The beautiful colors of the park transform throughout the four seasons, and the cherry blossoms, wisteria, water lilies, red spider lilies, and snowy landscapes fascinate and delight visitors. In addition to the Maruike Pond, the park has wisteria trellises, a grassy square, a playground area, a fountain square, an outdoor stage, a jogging track, and a STARBUCKS.

In particular, the wisteria trellises in Tennohgawa Park are on a magnificent scale, extending some 275 meters. The area is visited by numerous tourists during the Owari Tsushima Wisteria Festival, which is held from mid to late April. The entire area makes for a fantastic sight, enveloped in the sweet scent of the wisteria flowers.

Attractions of Tsushima

03 National important cultural properties
03 C-4 Hotta Family House
堀田家住宅
Old Hotta Riemon house. The first Yukimasa served as a low-class Samurai for Fukushima Masanori. It was built in the middle of the Edo period.

04 Honmachi-suji Street
04 D-2 (Kamikaido route Shimokaido route) 本町筋(上・下街道)
It is also called Tsushima Kamikaido route and Shimokaido route. Old towns remain along the street. Kamikaido route goes to Nogoya via Shobata and Jimokujii. Shimokaido route is connected to Sayakaido route.

05 Tangible Cultural Properties of Japan
05 D-3 Former Tsushima Shinjin Bank Head Office
05 D-3 Tsushima Tourism Promotion Center
津島市観光交流センター
As a commercial town, Tsushima had many banks. Tsushima Tourism Promotion Center was a two-story RC bank building which was built in 1929.

Shrine in Tsushima

*In no particular order

06 Seisho-Kosha Shrine
06 D-3 清正神社
This shrine is to enshrine Kato Kiyomasa, the military commander of the Sengoku period. In 1885, the shrine was built at the place where he lived with his uncle when he was little. This shrine was named after Kiyomasa. You can follow Kiyomasa's example and pray for success and safety.

07 Ichigamisha Shrine
07 D-2 市神社
It is a tutelary god in Nanakiri town. It still exists on the former road. It is dedicated to a god praying for business success and a good harvest.

08 Akiba-jinja Shrine (Hashizumecho)
08 D-4 秋葉神社 (橋詰町)
Three shrines—Akiba-jinja Shrine, Kotohira-gu Shrine, and Otsuchi-sha Shrine—are enshrined together. The main deity of Akiba-jinja Shrine is the Hono Kagu Tsuchi no Kami, the god of fire.

09 Otsuchisha Shrine
09 F-4 大土社
It is a tutelary god in Imachibacho town. In the main building of the shrine, there is a stone called Omokarusan. Usually, people come here to wish to have babies. Also, it might have the power to make all your wishes come true.

10 Toge-jinja Shrine
10 D-3 堤下神社
This is a worship place of Tshushima-jinja Shrine. It is believed to have the power to stop babies crying at night. You might find yourself blessed with the mysterious power of the gods of Tsushima...

Temple in Tsushima

*In no particular order

12 Ungoiji Temple
12 E-1 雲家寺
It belongs to Soto school of Zen Buddhism. It is Sengoku clan Hattori Koheita's temple where Gohyaku Rakan are placed.

13 Saikoiji Temple
13 E-2 西光寺
It belongs to Jodo sect of Buddhism. It was relocated from Kyoto in Meiji period.

14 Joshinbo Temple
14 E-3 戒信坊
It belongs to the Otani school of Jodo Shinshu sect of Buddhism. People call it Tsushimagobo. It is a 600-year-old temple.

15 Kaizenji Temple
15 E-2 海善寺
It belongs to Soto school of Zen sect of Buddhism. It has a hall exclusively for Zen meditation.

16 Zuisenji Temple
16 E-5 瑞泉寺
It belongs to Jodo sect of Buddhism. It is a bodhisattva temple of Prince Ryo-o who is the great-grandson of Emperor Go-Daigo. He was also a priest of Tsushima-jinja Shrine. Himurocho, the poet of Edo period, had a tea-ceremony room in this temple.

17 Kannonji Temple
17 F-3 観音寺
It belongs to Shingon sect of Buddhism. Oda Nobunaga had faith in this temple. It was combined with Jinguiji Temple from Tsushima Tennen-sha Shrine.

18 Kisshoji Temple (Nakanochi)
18 F-5 吉祥寺 (中野町)
It belongs to Shingon sect of Buddhism. Before Meiji period, the priest from Yatsurugisha Shrine was sent here. It withstood the Nobi earthquake with a magnitude of 8.

19 Rendaiji Temple
19 F-4 蓮台寺
It belonged to single-minded school before. The Bishamon statue in the temple was said to be brought by Oda Nobunaga. It is believed to bring you luck.

20 Kozenji Temple
20 F-4 興隆寺
It belongs to Soto school of Zen sect of Buddhism. It has a wooden statue of Gozu Tenny which is registered as one of Designated Cultural Property of Tsushima city.

21 Jorakuji Temple
21 E-3 常楽寺
It belongs to Soto school of Zen sect of Buddhism. It has the tomb of the poet Himuro Chouo of the Edo period.

22 Saihoji Temple
22 E-3 西方寺
It belongs to Jodo sect of Buddhism. It has statues of Juo in the main hall.

23 Hosenji Temple
23 E-3 宝泉寺
It belongs to Jodo sect of Buddhism. It has the Shoin style of the old Hattori House which is registered as one of National Cultural Property.

24 Hojuin Temple
24 B-3 宝寿院
It belongs to Shingon sect of Buddhism. At the time of Shinbutsu Shugo (the syncretism of Buddhism and kami worship), it was the Jinguiji (shrine temple) of Tsushima Tennen Shrine.

25 Honjuji Temple
25 F-5 本住寺
It belongs to Jodo Shinshu sect of Buddhism. The name was Konjuji before. And it was relocated from Shiotacho Aisai city in the middle of the Edo period.

26 Myoenji Temple
26 E-4 妙延寺
It belongs to school of Nichiren. It was the temple where Sengoku clan Kato Kiyomasa studied when he was little.

27 Fudoin Temple
27 E-1 不動院
It belongs to Shingon sect of Buddhism. It was Shokakuin temple which was used to host the poet Souchou by Oda Nobunaga in the Sengoku period. It played the role of a guest house for the Oda family.

28 Jokoji Temple
28 D-5 浄光寺
It belongs to the Otani school of Jodo Shinshu sect of Buddhism. The temple was Saya anzaisho (a temporary lodging built for imperial visit) for Emperor Meiji before.

29 Saifukuji Temple
29 D-5 西福寺
It belongs to Jodo Buddhism. It was enshrined Fudomyo (Acala) of Naritasan Shinshoji Temple in Meiji period.

The four festivals in Tsushima

There are three historic festivals of God, which are the Kaihishi in winter, Owari Tsushima Tennen Festival in summer and Owari Tsushima Autumn Festival in autumn. Also, there is the Owari Tsushima Wisteria Festival. You can enjoy the festivals all year round.
